



Ballot for Next Generation Group Officers 2010-2012

Each member of the Next Generation Group (NGG) is allowed one vote per position. Therefore you can only vote for one person for president, for treasurer, for secretary. There are two vice president positions, so you are allowed to vote for no more than two candidates for this office. There will be no voting by proxy or absentee voting. All eligible voters must be present for the live vote.

If a tie vote should occur for any of the positions listed below, there will be non-ballot voting where members will vote by writing their candidate on a piece of paper. The candidate who garners the most votes will be elected to the office.

Tenures for NGG Officers are two years.

President

The president helps define the agenda of the Next Generation Group, such developing activities and programs that will help strengthen bonds among current members, that will attract new members and that will contribute to enhancing the public visibility of family associations and their role in the broader Asian and Pacific Islander (API) community of Los Angeles. The president will approve use of funds from the NGG account. The president convenes and presides over all NGG general membership and executive meetings, or appoints another officer as proxy. The president represents NGG at the monthly Eng Family Benevolent Association L.A. Chapter Board meetings and association social functions and may also be asked to represent the association at other chapter functions such as spring banquets.

Co-Vice President

The vice president is authorized to represent the NGG at official family association functions and other designated community events. The vice president may also facilitate the board meeting in absence of the president—provided a quorum exists. The vice president may oversee NGG projects, programs and activities as assigned, appointed or selected. The vice president may be asked to represent NGG at the monthly Eng Family Benevolent Association L.A. Chapter Board meetings (in absence of the president) and association social functions and may also be asked to represent the association at other chapter functions such as spring banquets.

Co-Vice President

The vice president is authorized to represent the NGG at official family association functions and other designated community events. The vice president may also facilitate the board meeting in absence of the president—provided a quorum exists. The vice president may oversee NGG projects, programs and activities as assigned, appointed or selected. The vice president may be asked to represent NGG at the monthly Eng Family Benevolent Association L.A. Chapter Board meetings (in absence of the president) and association social functions and may also be asked to represent the association at other chapter functions such as spring banquets.

Treasurer

The treasurer is responsible for the management and maintenance of NGG funds. The treasurer will handle all bank deposits, collections and the disbursement of funds to cover expenses and reimbursements as authorized by the NGG Board.

Secretary

The responsibility of the secretary is to record meeting minutes and upon approval of the board majority make available to the membership (posting on the NGG website for download). The secretary also may be one of two signatories on checks issued by the Next Generation Group for activity/program expenses.
